

## FleetManager 2007 (Due for Launch end 2007)

The ACT FleetManager Application is designed to allow the management of not just vehicles, but a whole host of different resources.

Originally designed for the management of Plant Equipment and Commercial Vehicles, this product is now able to be customised for the management of many resources from rooms to people and physical equipment.

When using FleetManager in a Commercial Vehicle Management role, the application can cover the following functions:

- User-defined data recording of vehicles, vehicle owners, customers, drivers & financial controllers
- Each Vehicle can have up to 52 sub-resources (i.e. Air-Conditioning Unit, Air Compressor, Tail Lift, Tachograph etc...)
- Each Vehicle & Sub-Resource can have up to 9 key dates associated with it.
- Each date can have up to 9 different actions (i.e. Generate Service Reminder) each with a user-defined calculation.
- Each Vehicle or Sub-Resource can collect action transactions (i.e. Transaction Carried Out, Mileage, Date, Financial etc...) from external OLEDB or ODBC data sources.
- The reporting suite includes all standard outputs including Reminder Letters, Graphical projections, anomalies, missing data etc... and these can all be printed, displayed on-screen, emailed, faxed or even sent by SMS.

You can also bolt-on the following modules:

- Financial Cost Control – Budgeting, Forecasting and reporting for any Vehicle, Sub-Resource, Customer, Franchise etc...
- Front-Line – Financial Reporting that allows estimated cost projection with user-defined cost factoring per Vehicle.

FleetManager 2007 is a Multi-User, Multi-depot, Multi-Franchise Application.

FleetManager 2007 offers integration with any OLEDB or ODBC backend database.

FleetManager 2007 is Parameter driven per user, depot and franchise.
